NSPCC Speak out. Stay safe. Programme



We are participating in the NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe. Programme this term. Speak out. Stay safe. is a programme for children aged 5-11 which aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a safe adult or Childline.

This child friendly programme is aligned with the curriculum and consists of age appropriate virtual assemblies and supporting classroom based activities which we have reviewed. Trees!

Just before the Easter holidays, the Woodland Trust Scotland gifted the school around 100 young trees which had been grown on from seeds collected from Orkney trees (rowan, downy birch and aspen). We are very grateful to them for funding this gesture and also to UHI Orkney and the Orkney Woodland Project for their part in allowing us to receive them, along with their helpful advice and support.

The trees are not much more than saplings and will need to be planted in their permanent spots in the next few weeks. We would really appreciate some adult volunteers to help us prepare the planting holes initially (probably next Saturday morning, any time between 10:00-13:00, weather dependent) and then have adults and children involved in putting the trees into the ground on a separate

occasion. Further updates/reminders/dates/times will be notified via Seesaw.

Adults would need to bring their own straight-edged, strong spade and wear sturdy footwear as each tree needs its own hole and we have to dig into quite dense ground. Thanking you in advance.

P5-7 STEM After School Club

The school has recently received a set of resources allowing us to take part in the British Science Association's CREST SuperStar Award. This involves a series of hands-on problem solving challenges. The children will receive a SuperStar Award certificate upon completion of all eight hour long activities.
